Section I - Chapter address

Section II - Duties of the Officers

- a. President: The President shall preside at all meetings, and shall be the chief executive of the club. He shall have general supervision over the development of its entire program. He shall make all committee appointments subject to approval by the general membership of the chapter.
- b. Vice-President: Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President in his/her absence, and other duties as may be prescribed by the members.
- c. Secretary: The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings and maintain a file of reports, a file of correspondence, and maintain an up-to-date record of any business of the chapter.
- c. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall be responsible for the collection of chapter fees, and the maintaining of financial records regarding the chapter's receipts and expenditures.

Section III - Meetings

- a. The regular meetings of this chapter shall be held on the second Wednesday of each month.
- b. Special meetings of the chapter shall be held on call of the President, or upon a written call to the chapter membership.

Section IV - Elections

- a. It is understood that all officers and directors shall serve without renumeration.
- b. After one year, the officers, and directors, if any, will be elected by the majority vote.

Section V - Committees

Section VI - Amendments

a. The by-laws may be amended by a majority vote, at any regularly scheduled chapter meeting.

Gary Long, President of the Classic GTO Club (not to be confused with the Classic GTO Association of Denver), called for membership balloting in the April '84 edition of the Classic GTO Newsletter to see if the membership wanted to become a Chapter of the GTOAA. The response was overwhelming, with a unanimous vote to join with the GTOAA.

The Classic GTO Club publishes a monthly newsletter containing some excellent information and good classified advertising. I may want to suggest that they consider a new name for their publication, the Classic GTO Newsletter, as there is currently an independent, copywrited publication out of Texas with the same title. The Club has been entering car shows, offers T-shirts and jackets, has a Club photo album going, and holds regular meetings. See the new, updated Chapter listing enclosed for their address, then drop them a note and let them know what your Chapter is doing.

GATEWAY GTO ASSOCIATION is moving along very nicely. President Greg Pugh recently precided at a Club meeting in a Mienieke Muffler Shop with a turnout of 30 people. Darn good for a new Chapter! Jack Brandl, an enthusiastic new member to the Chapter, was unanimously voted in as V.P., and the Chapter is now working on printing a roster, publishing a newsletter, getting Club jackets, having a banner made to display at events, making window decals, and putting together a cruise night. IN DENVER, the Classic GTO Association of Denver has been going full throttle. Membership has grown so rapidly, the Chapter had to move out of their existing meeting facilities. The last time I talked to Secretary/Treasurer Mark and Dee Kaiser, there were so many new applications to the Club that an exact membership count was unavailable. We're guessing around 80. The new meeting facilities will be at a new Pontiac Dealership, who is furnishing a brand new conference room, video and film facilities, and some super discounts through the Parts Department. Since the Chapters are intended to support the needs of their members on a LOCAL basis, we ask that you refer these long-distance inquiries to the GTDAA. Please avoid recruiting members living outside of a 100 mile radius of your Chapter headquarters unless they really understand that they are joining a LOCAL organization which may be of limited value to them at their present geographical location. Send them a GTDAA application, as this will in most cases be of more interest to someone who lives too far away to be able to participate in the Chapter activities and events.

IN CALIFORNIA, one of most member-rich States, we currently have about $si\times$ different people working on putting together Chapters in various areas. It'll be interesting to see what happens, and I'll keep you all posted on this activity.

WHAT DO YOU THINK about this flyer? Is this something you would like to see continue? Let me know.

Please keep sending me reports on what your Chapters are doing. I will put together some News Flyers like this on a regular basis if you feel this is useful information. Please provide me with some news occasionally, and let me know about your events, and some of your ideas so that I can pass this information on to everybody else.

CHAPTER REQUIREMENTS

In order to form a Chapter, it has been determined that the following requirements must be met:

- The Chapter must be formed by at least 5 (five) members of the GTO Association of America.
- 2. At least 5 (five) members of the GTO Association of America must sign the Chapter Petition.
- A copy of Chapter By-Laws and Chapter Constitution must be submitted to the Vice President for Chapter Coordination. Should the Chapter be incorporated, a copy of Articles of Incorporation must also be submitted.
- 4. Chapters should encompass a geographical area of no more than 300 miles radius from Chapter Headquarters. Exceptions to this must be approved by the Chapter Coordinator.
- 5. The above items must be mailed to the Vice President for Chapter Coordination of the GTO Association of America, 10831 Ingalls Circle, Broomfield, CO 80020.

CHAPTER RESPONSIBILITIES

In addition to contributing towards the accomplishment of the goals and objectives of the Association as outlined in the GTO Association of America Articles of Incorporation, Article III, Sections A and B, Chapter will be required to:

- Keep the Chapter Coordinator informed on the following:
 a) Any change in the Chapter's mailing address,
 - b) Any change in personnell, officers, etc.
- 2. Submit a monthly report on the Chapter's activities.
- Submit a copy of all Chapter publications to allow us to gain some insight into what the Chapters are doing, and be of help and assistance to the Chapters.



SUGGESTIONS

Organizing and running a Chapter will require a lot of your personal time, effort, and, occasionally, money. However, the rewards in terms of satisfaction and accomplishment are great. During my terms as a Chapter President, I have received phone calls from members ranging from questions on how to remove door handles to requests for bail money. I have spent my own money on everything from postage stamps to cases of beer to keep the Club going and together. As your Chapter grows, you will encounter all of the difficulties and challenges involved with maintaining and keeping the interests of a group of people with interests varying from racing to restoration.

If all this still sounds fascinating to you, you're ready to get your Chapter off the ground. Here are some guidelines to help you:

1. ORGANIZATION

A Chapter will be as organized as its leaders. Set up your Board of Directors in such a way that every person's abilities are utilized to their fullest. Don't let it become a popularity contest. That's the quickest way to turn your potentially successful Chapter into a failure.

In addition to the Board of Directors, you may wish to involve your membership more (or they will want to be involved more) once your Chapter starts growing. You can do this by having the Board of Directors assign Officers to certain positions on an annual basis. For example, the member who races his bracket car every weekend may have some insight into track rules and may know the track owner. He may be perfect for an Officer position like "Competitive Events Coordinator". You may have a very outgoing person in your Chapter who would be perfect for use as your "Public Relations Coordinator" to advertise your events and maintain a rapport with other area Clubs. The list can go on and on. Use your imagination, and utilize your membership effectively. Otherwise you'll end up with a lot of inactive members.

2. MEMBERSHIP

The quality of your Chapter will reflect the quality of your members, which in turn affects the quality of the members you'll be able to recruit. If you consistantly recruit slobby members with sloppy, Chevy-powered cars, your Chapter will gain a sloppy image, and you'll have a very difficult time recruiting the high-class GTO owner with the nice car. You may wish to establish an acceptance criteria for new members in your Chapter, or require that each new applicant attend two meetings and be accepted through a majority vote of the Board of Directors. Use your own judgement, but be aware that the type and quality of your members will either make or break your Chapter.

3. RECRUITMENT

One of the most difficult aspects of running your Chapter will be recruiting new members. Face it - there just aren't thousands of GTO's in your immediate neighborhood. Perhaps the most effective way to "beat the bush" is to have some nice flyers printed. Don't scribble something up with a felt marker and Xerox it. Take your ideas down to your local printer, negotiate a little on the price, and have him typeset the thing and run you off 200 copies. This will cost around \$20.00, but it's worth it to have it done professionally (image, remember?). You may even integrate the information flyer with your application for membership, similar to the GTO Association of America applications. Now, have your members distribute these to parts stores, and stick them under the wiper blades of every nice GTO oyu see on the street. Keep a small stack of flyers with you in your car wherever you go. You can even organize membership recruitment contests with some kind of prize for the winner. See the attached flyer used by the Classic GTO Association of Denver for some ideas.

4. FUND RAISING

Almost any activity you undertake will cost something, whether it be mailing out an application or buying trophies for a car show. Funds can be raised several ways. The most obvious, and easiest, method is to charge dues from every member. Remember that this fee will be in addition to dues to the GTO Association of America, so keep your Chapter dues reasonable. The more you have to offer your members, the more you may be able to charge in dues. So get some snazzy membership cards printed up, and maybe have some Chapter window decals made with a logo of your own design. Advertise the decals in the "Gas Can" and sell them at a slight profit to the Club. Then take your logo down to the custom T-shirt shop and have a box full of T-shirts made. Sell them to your members and to members of the GTO Association. If you live in a cooler climate, you can do the same with some nice lined jackets.

Now that you've established your identity with cards, decals, T-shirts, and jackets, and have made some money also, find out which other car clubs operate in your area. Go to some of their events and let them know you exist. Get their President's name and address. Find out what kind of events turn them on. Determine what you like and don't like about their events and see what kind o mistakes they make. Then get your members together, plan your own event, make it bigger and better than the other guys', invite the local TV stations out and let the newspapers know. In Denver it's not uncommon to get 100 cars, vans and trucks out for an event, charge \$10.00 per entry, and spend less than \$200.00 for the whole thing. This adds up to a nice \$800.00 profit for the Club.

BY LAWS
GTO ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA
Preliminary draft

Section I Membership

- a. For definition purposes a GTO is defined as an automobile, built by the Pontiac Division of the General Motors Corporation as an option on the Pontiac Le Mans (Tempest) in 1964 and 1965, as a model of the Pontiac line in 1966, 1967, 1968, 1969, 1970, 1971, as an option on the Le Mans in 1972, 1973, and as an option on the Ventura in 1974.
- b. Ownership of a Pontiac GTO is not a prerequisite for becoming a
 member of the GTO Association of America.
- xc. Age limitations there are no age limitations.
 - d. Geographical limitations The Association has no geographical limitations on membership, ___ the board of directors may at its discretion enact differential membership dues rates for members who live outside the borders of the United States. Differential rates shall not be charged retroactively.
 - e. ACTIVE MEMBER An active member is a person who has paid his/her dues for the current year. Current year is considered to begin when the member's dues are received by the GTO Association of America.
 - f. For definition purposes, a current year shall be 12 months, regardless of actual days that may transpire from receipt of the member's dues.
 - g. Dues shall be set at the discretion of the board of directors.
 - h. HONORARY MEMBER
 Honorary members shall not be required to pay Association dues, and they will be entitled to all Association benefits except for the right to vote and hold office. Honorary members are individuals who have made a significant contribution to the GTO Association of America, and are selected by a majority vote of the board of directors. Honorary membership is extended for a period of one year, and shall be renewed at the discretion of the board of directors.
 - i. HONORARY BOARD MEMBER Honorary board members are individuals, who, on account of their expertise in certain areas, have been invited to sit on the board of directors in an advisory capacity, and have accepted this invitation. Honorary board members are not required to attend all board meetings, and may do so at times of their choosing. Honorary board members are selected by a majority vote of the board of directors. The honorary board member's term shall be one year, and shall be renewed at the discretion of the board of directors.
 - j. Additional membership categories shall be instituted at the discretion of the board of directors.

Section II Officers and Directors

- a. The Association shall be governed initially by a hoard of 5 (three) directors.
- b. The board of directors rhall be empowered to conduct the hardward of the Association in accordance with the Articles of Incorporation
- c. The board of directors shall serve without renumeration.
- d. Matters pertaining to Section II of the by-laws shall be governed directly by Article VIII of the Articles of Incorporation.
- e. The board of directors shall serve for an initial period of one year, commencing May 30, 1979.

f. The board of directors shall be empowered to select a minimum of three officers to conduct administrative functions for the Association, namely, a President, Vice President and Treasurer. It will be permissible for one officer to serve in more than one, but less than three capacities as outlined above.

g. The board of directors will review, and act upon Section II of the by-laws of this Association prior to May 30, 1980 for the purpose of determining methods of replacement, re-election, and election of board members and Association officials.

Officers and Directors, Duties of, and description

- a. Duties pertaining to the directors are outlined in section II of the by-laws.
- b. The initial officers of the corporation shall be:
 - 1. President
 - Vice-President
 Treasurer
- c. PRESIDENT
- The president shall be in charge of the day to day administration of the Association, setting goals, objectives, and implementing methods whereby these goals and objectives may be achieved in an efficient and expeditious manner. The president shall be charged with setting association policy, formulating the association budget, and delegating duties to club members as needed to accomlish said objectives.
- X d. VICE PRESIDENT The vice president shall report directly to the president, and will be charged with serving as administrative assistant to the president in the execution of his/her duties.
- X e. TREASURER + SEC The treasurer shall serve as comptroller to the Association, and will initially be charged with designing and implementing an adequate accounting system for the Association, making sure that appropriate controls and audit trails are built into the system as to properly safeguard Association funds. The treasurer shall reto properly safeguard Association funds. port directly to the president and the board of directors. Reports shall consist of cash basis statements of revenues and expenditures and accrual basis statement of Assets, Liabilities and Fund Balance

Amendments

a. Current amendments to the by-laws shall be initiated by the board of directors.

Ouorum, meetings

- The board of directors shall not transact Association business unless all hoard members (not including honorary) are present.
- meetings shall be called as needed by the board of directors.

Section VI Legal Counsel

- a. The Association shall retain as its legal cousel, the Jones Law Firm, 306 First Federal Building, Billings, Montana.
- t. Length of retainership (ah) 1 be at the discretion of the board of directors.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION GTO ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA preliminary draft

ARTICLE I.

The name of the corporation shall be GTO ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA.

ARTICLE II.

The period of duration of the corporation is perpetual, unless otherwise provided by law, or unless dissolved pursuant to law.

ARTICLE III.

The objects and purposes for which said corporation is formed are exclusively charitable and educational and notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by an organization exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code. the objects and purposes include:

- (A)
- X To promote the preservation, enjoyment and restoration of Pontiac GTO automobiles. To educate both public and legislative bodies at all levels of these cars' contributions to the world's automotive, social and industrial history.
- The development and administration of programs for GTO Association members, dealing with the preservation, enjoyment and restoration of Pontiac GTO automobiles. To establish, implement, and maintain such programs as is necessary to accomplish said goals; to assist in the best interests of the corporation and to society as a whole, and to raise funds for carrying the same into effect in any manner allowed by these articles of incorporation and the By-laws of the organization, and under the laws of the State of Montana and the United States, as the same shall be permitted;
 - To purchase, hold, pledge, transfer, sell, or otherwise dispose of or deal in, the shares of capital stock, bonds, dehentures, notes, or other securities or evidences of indebtedness of any corporation, to receive, collect and dispose of dividends, interest or other income of any such securities held by it, and to do any and all acts and things tending to increase the value of said corporation; to issue bonds and secure the same by pledge or deed of trust or upon any part of such securities or other properties held or owned by the corporation and to sell or pledge such bonds for proper corporate purposes and in promotion of its corporate business; to purchase, receive, hold and dispose of any securities of any person or corporation, wether such securities shall be bonds, mortgages, debentures, notes, shares of capital stocks or otherwise, and in respect to any such securities, to excercise any and all rights and priviledges of ownership thereof, and to purchase and hold real and personal property and any and all interest therein for the benefit of said corporation and in general to excercise and perform any and all powers necessary, incident and convenient to the business aforesaid.

ARTICLE III. continued

- (D)
 To appoint such subordinate officers or agents as the business of the corporation may require and to allow them suitable compensation;
- (E)
 To make By-laws not inconsistent with any existing laws for the management of its property and the regulation of its affairs;
- (F)
 To enter into any obligation or contract, or to do anything essential to the transaction of its ordinary business;
- (G)
 That it is a corporation which does not contemplate any pecuniary gain or profit to the members thereof.

ARTICLE IV.

- (A)
 The registered office of the corporation is located at 1239
 Sun Valley Road, Yellowstone County, Montana.
- (B) The mailing address of the corporation shall be Box 20614, Billings, Montana 59104
- (C)
 The registered agent of the corporation is Antoine J.J. Bastien whose post office address is Box 20614, Billings, Montana 59104.

ARTICLE V.

This corporation shall possess the following powers;

- (A)
 To sue and be sued;
- (B)
 To contract and be contracted with;
- (C)
 To receive property by devise and bequest, subject to the laws regulating the transfer of property by Will, and to otherwise acquire and hold all property, real or personal, including shares of stock, bonds, and securities of other corporations;
- (D)
 To act as Trustees under any trust incidental to the principal object of the corporation, and to receive, hold, administer and expend funds and property subject to such trust;
- (E)
 To convey, exchange, lease, mortgage, encumber, transfer from trust, or otherwise dispose of all property, real or personal;
- (F)
 To seek grants, borrow money, contract debts, and issue bonds, notes, and debentures, and secure the same;
- (G)
 To do all other acts or form such other groups, associations, or organizations, pursuant to law, necessary or expedient for the administration of affairs and attainment of the purposes of the corporation.


The GTO Association of Central Ohio is planning an all GTO show at Haydocy Pontiac on Sunday, June 9, 1985.


Letter from the Prez:
