Rally in Jan. Spring Show Nationals Update

Introduction of new officers

SECRETARY'S NOTES

It was a cold and rainy late autumn night when 19 members of the GTOACO gathered at the East-side Donato's Pizza parlor for their 12th November meeting. Club members began to warm up over pizza, beer, and goat talk, when around 7:20 p.m. Nick Anspach called the meeting to order.

As Nick asked for an approval of the October minutes, Jeff Inskeep spoke up with a smirk and offered a correction: "I object to the statement from last month's minutes about the color 'red' being the 'proper' color for the new jackets." Jeff wanted that stricken from the minutes, but Nick was quick to retort, "Jeff's just jealous because these jackets don't come in primer!" After that issue was laid to rest, Rob Wilson delivered the Treasurer's report and then Nick launched into the Old Business:

Christmas Party. Lynn Inskeep reported that the party would be held on 13 December at the airport Holiday Inn. She arranged for a poolside bar to commence at 7:00 p.m. with a buffet dinner to follow. The club will be paying for half of everyone's cost of the buffet. Lynn urged members to return to her as soon as possible the reservation card/ballots that were mailed out in last month's Paw Prints. The club has also rented a room with a wet bar to serve as a hospitality suite where we can adjourn after the buffet. Jeff Inskeep will be in charge of planning the entertainment for the evening — featuring, among other things, a repeat performance of his famous tomato—throwing contest.

New Jackets. Once again, Rob Wilson announced that new club jackets were available if anyone wished to order them at a cost of approximately \$40 (depending upon the quantity of orders). Bill Barton requested that the club pick up \$10 of the cost for each member who wanted one of these new jackets, but Nick pointed out that the club had already contributed by paying for the set-up costs involved in executing the computer-generated logo.

Spring Show & Swap Meet. Rob reported that he would be meeting with Dave Gill the very next Monday to discuss the possibility of Dave Gill Pontiac hosting our spring show. The club defined several requirements that need to be met by any potential sponsor of our show:

- space for 75 to 100 cars, 30 vendors, and a tabulation area
- access to phones, restrooms
- e willingness to sponsor trophies and advertising

We will be offering the same classes for this show that were offered at our 1984 spring Haydocy show, except that there will no longer be separate convertible classes. Nick stated that we needed to pick a show chairperson and date that evening. Rob volunteered to serve as the show chair, and Ron Landis was asked to take charge of the Swap Meet because of his vendor expertise demonstrated at the Nationals this summer where he proved his pecuniary prowess by peddling pick-up loads of prime parts that he had procured from his peers and his property. May 3rd was offered by the GTOACO hierarchy as the date for the spring show, with May 10th as the back-up rain date.

Annual Parts Issue of the Paw Prints. Our esteemed Editor will be devoting the entire December issue of the Paw Prints to a feature of parts lists from GTOACO members. This is your chance to be a big-time parts wheeler/dealer like Ron Landis! Jeff requested that potential parts merchants turn in typed lists of their enticing wares to him as soon as possible -- prior to 30 November.

Elections. Nick and Jeff urged everyone to be sure to fill out their ballots received in the November Paw Prints and vote for their favorite candidates in the upcoming election of officers. This prompted Bill Barton to interject that he would have liked to have seen more people nominated for the officer positions. Several people then hastened to remind Bill that while his concern may be well-meaning, it was ill-timed, as nominations had been requested at last month's meeting, which he did not attend.

Membership and Dues. Jeff Inskeep announced that the 1987 club dues would be the same as this year's -- \$15. Members are requested to pay their dues prior to 31 January if they wish to continue to receive the Paw Prints. Jeff mentioned that he was working on a member-profile questionnaire that would be circulated soon to disclose more information about our various members, such as

their occupations. This information might be useful in professional networking and business synergy — connecting members in a symbiotic, mutually beneficial relationship. For example, connecting a member who is an interior decorator with one who builds houses, a member who is a printer with one who writes manuals and workbooks, a member who is a principal with one who needs disciplined, etc.

Neal Blankenship announced that the $1\overline{987\ GTOAA\ National}$ Meet will be held here again in Columbus over the 4th of July holiday weekend.
