This agency took over our Parents Anonymous support group system.



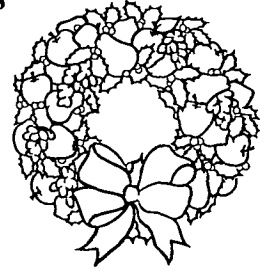

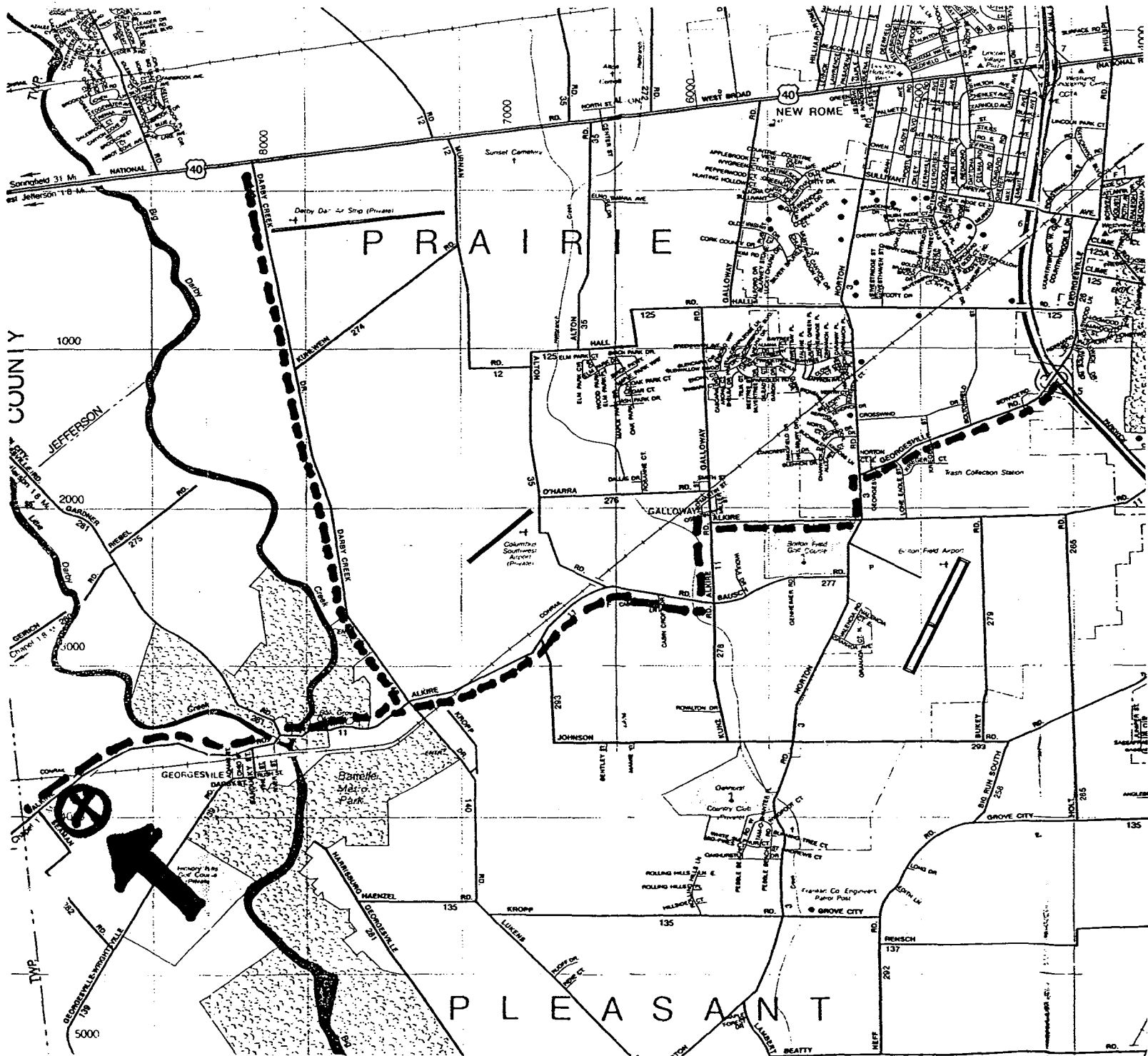

Enclosed is my application and check. I'm looking forward to joining the club.

Anyway, I want to get the safety stuff out of the way before I start on the drivetrain and body. Already done the little bit of frame repair it needed.

I have a little experience working on cars (built some engines, etc.), but I need a lot of help on electrical, suspension, body work. One of the reasons I want to join the club is to meet people with that knowledge and maybe access to parts. The other reason for joining is that I just love being around these cars and people who play with them.

I manage the computer programming department for an insurance company, teach computer courses at Columbus State at night, and have been a disk jockey for about 15 years. I'd be happy to help the club with that newsletter and any computer-related stuff like helping other members learn how to use a computer, maybe maintaining an inventory list of who has what parts or knows what stuff, etc.

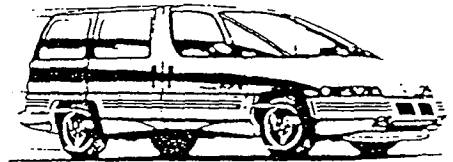

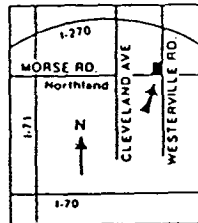

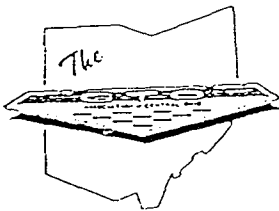
