## Member Spotlight! - Jeff Frazier!

Perhaps Jeff is best known for his love of GTOs running Cragars (and the stock vs modified discussions that ensue:), or maybe you know him best for his signature Tiger that graces his convertible at shows (what a stunning resemblance between him and that tiger:), or maybe you just know what a great person he is and that he's one of the most senior members in our club (along with a few others; sorry Donna:). However you know him, you love him. I hope you enjoy this piece, written by him: In a time far, far away... My family always had been into drag racing. We ran Mopars(sorry, everyone, but it gets better; honestly). Dad always said, "drive what you will but we race Mopars.." We ran a 65 hemi in SS/A for years.

My first introduction to a GTO was a Gold 66 Tri-power with a 4 speed that my Uncle Jim had (I told you it would get better). We rebuilt the engine and raced it at Norwalk and around Columbus in 1968 and I was a senior in high school. I loved that car. Uncle Jim would let me take him to work on weekends and I could keep the car out. Since he worked night shift for the Dispatch, he didn't want it sitting downtown all weekend (Lucky me!). I ran it hard to all the local hotspots (Jerry's, Green Gables, Mainliner and Beverly drive-ins). I had a ball with that car!

I went in the Army in 1969 and darn it if he didn't sell it and get a 69 Olds 442. It broke my heart when I heard that he had done that. Overseas, my locker always had a picture of a 69 Judge. When I discharged in 1972, first thing I did was buy a blue 67 GTO convertible! Dad wanted me to buy a 69 400 4 speed Firebird but I had to have a GTO! I paid \$800 for my first GTO and I drove it for a couple of years. After that for some reason I wanted a 70 Charger. What can I say? Mopar was in my blood, even if it was just a little.

Well you know how it goes, I got married, bought a house, had 2 children and no money for another GTO. But the heart wants what the heart wants. So when the kids were about 6 and 3 I found a white 66 GTO out in Pickertington for \$1700. It was a post car with a column automatic. It had red interior, a 389 and a 4 barrel. Of course, I put a set of Cragars on it with raised white letter tires and had it for about 17 years. I took this car on vacation and drove it to work downtown for 3 or 4 years.

In 1984, saw I an ad in the paper about some folks who wanted to start up a local GTO club. Interested people should meet down along Scioto river at a shelter house. So I went down there and met a few of these folks. You may even know some of them. The rest, as they say, is history. For about 20 some years now, I've had a lot of fun times and met good friends through this club over those years. We have lost some friends but gained many more.

A few of the cars in the club have been in the club a long time too. They've been traded or bought but they've stayed in the club. I had to sell my 66 but a few years later, I bought another GTO that I drive today. My 68 blue convertible 400 4 speed. It is PHS documented and is I of 3016 4 speed convertibles made that year. ## Member Spotlight! - continued


Every GTO I have had has always had a set of Cragars on it and this one is no different.

**Transformation** by Steve Schaeffer

I recently converted two GM A bodies from Turbine 300 2 speed automatics to Turbo 400 3 speed automatics. The performance difference is amazing. You have a much stronger low gear and a real passing gear.

Desk Top Drags computes that a 68 Cutlass 350 4v would be .3 seconds faster in the quarter mile. A 64 to 66 442 producing 319 net HP using a 3.55 rear end and a 2500 rpm stall speed converter would be 0.472 seconds faster in the quarter mile. The same car would be 0.369 seconds faster 0 to 60mph. This is performance that you can really feel.

I used the automatic shifter conversion from The Shiftworks (585-383-0574; www.shiftworks.com). They sell a kit to convert your original floor shifter

To the classic low, super, drive, neutral, reverse, park shift pattern, the kit contains a new detent plate for your shifter and all brackets and bolts. They also stock the correct shift cable. The car still looks completely original.

You need to use a short tail Turbo 400 transmission from any 67 to early 80s Cadillac, Buick, Olds, or Pontiac. You will need to move the transmission cross member back approximately 1.5 inches. You also have to shorten the drive shaft a like amount and use the big yoke for a Turbo 400. The electric kick down is the same for the 300 and 400 trans. Just plug your stock wire into the new transmission.

I prefer to use a Turbo 400 over a Turbo 350. The Turbo 400 is the strongest unmodified trans that GM ever built for a passenger car. It will hold the torque from a built 455 engine with no problems. A rebuilt B/O/P Turbo 400 trans #555-60315 is available from Jegs for \$849.99.

The Turbo 350 is a lighter duty unit. It controls throttle pressure/ kick down with a cable. I did not want the cable and bracket to show when I open the hood.

I am not a big fan of using a700R4 or a 200R4 in a B/O/P muscle car. The 700R4 case only fits a Chevy block. It requires an adaptor plate to fit our engines. The 200R4 will bolt up but it is a very lite duty trans in stock form. It was originally based on the old metric 200. If you do want to use one Eat My Shift.com has a package available for \$1,895.00. They advertise that their transmission is safe to 450 horsepower.

New transmission cooling lines are available from The Right Stuff (800-405-2000). Part #ATC6715 is for a Turbo 400 in a 67 GTO. A 67 GTO still uses an old style radiator with top and bottom tanks. These lines should fit other GM cars with this style radiator. We bent our own new cooling lines for our 65 Cutlass. For a 66-67 Cutlass or 442 that uses a cross flow radiator use part # ATC6602. Cost is \$45.00 for original or \$75.00 for stainless.

The Turbo 400 is light years ahead of the old 2 speed transmission. It transformed my cars and made driving them more enjoyable. The cars still use the original shifter and console. The only visible change inside the car is the shift indicator plate.

If you are really driving your car, this "Transformation" can not be beat.


