Solving a Choking Problem by Steve Schaeffer

After you have installed your new aftermarket intake manifold you will discover one small problem. There is no way to hook up the factory choke.

If you are using a Holley or Edelbrock carburetor it will either be set up for a manual choke or an electric choke. Problem solved. But what do you do if you want to run a GM Quadrajet carb? All of the '67 to '72 GTOs came with a Quadrajet carburetor. This carburetor had a stove type choke that mounted on the intake manifold.

I just installed a Performance Products Crosswind intake on a Pontiac 421 engine. I am using a '71 Pontiac 800cfm Quadrajet carburetor. I disabled the choke so it is always open. This will be fine in the hot summer but not very practical on a cold day. The solution is to use a '73 or newer non computer controlled Quadrajet carburetor.

This carburetor uses the round climate style choke. I then converted it to an electric choke using the choke housing and plate off of a later GM electronic Quadrajet which are throw away carburetors. I also did one using the choke off a Dual jet carburetor. This carburetor is like the front half of a Quadrajet 4 barrel carburetor. I still have my Pontiac build Quadrajet carburetor and I have a working choke.


