Member Spotlight on Steve Schaeffer by Steve Schaeffer

Steve and Barb Schaeffer have been members of the GTOACO since 1994.

Steve purchased his first new Pontiac in 1963. It was a silver 389 Catalina convertible. With a 4 barrel carb, dual exhaust, and a 3.64 POSI rear end, he was king of the world until he raced his first 409 Chevy. His 2nd new Pontiac was a 65 Catalina 2+2 2dr hardtop. Running a built 421 Tri-Power, 4 speed with a 4.11 gear, that car really ran. He still has the trophies he won with it.

Pontiac number 3 was a serious 62 Catalina 2 door hard top race car. We ran as a 333 horsepower 389 4speed, or as a 348 horsepower Tri-Power 4 speed. This was an absolute killer car. We dominated the local drag strips. In 1969 we even took the 62 to Indianapolis Raceway Park where we won G stock!

Of course I wish I had been smart enough to keep all 3 of these cars. Today we have 5 collector cars. In 2010, we did 20 different shows. We were lucky enough to win at 18 of them with the 5 different cars. In 1971 I purchased my first GTO. A red 64 2 door hard top, 389, 4 speed, POSI. I originally built it to run C stock at the drags. When Jr stock racing fell out of favor I built a very strong 421 for the car. It was one of few street driven cars in the Pro Bracket. By the early 1990's I decided to restore the car back to original. Today I still own the same car completely restored to original condition.

In 1994 when I joined the GTOACO I purchased two 66 GTO project cars. Both were just the stripped out shell of the body on a rolling frame without any drive train, front end, or interiors. I brought them home along with several truck loads of parts. Pontiac Historical verified that all 3 cars were real GTO's and not clones. My friends looked at them and said they would never be on the road again.

Over a five year period I restored both cars. I built my engines and 4 speeds in my home garage. I did all the brakes, steering, and suspension at home. I also did the electrical, hung my front sheet metal and doors. I even had a friend help me build set up the POSI rear ends at home.

The first 66 GTO is a silver 2 door hard top restored to original. It is equipped with a 389, automatic, factory air conditioning, power steering and brakes, tinted glass, tilt steering, map lights, and rally I wheels with red line tires.

The 2nd 66 GTO was originally built to be a street –strip car. It is also a 2 door hard top. It has custom blue paint and a white interior. I am running a strong 462 cubic inch 4 bolt main Pontiac engine in it. It has a Muncie 4 speed trans and a 3.31 12 bolt rear end. I found out the hard way that a Pontiac 8.2 rear end will not live behind a 455 engine with cheater slicks at the drag strip.

Even with just a 3.31 gear the 66 GTO will run high 12 seconds at 106mph at the drags. In 1999 I won my class at the Jegs Championship Racing Series event at National Trails Raceway Park.

My 4th Pontiac project car started by accident. We where in Detroit for a family event and saw an ad for a 64 LeMans 2 door hard top body fresh from Calif. The owner paid big dollars for it and then found out from PHS that it was a 4speed HO car, but not a GTO.

I bought right on the spot.

I put the complete spare drive train that I already had from racing the 66 GTO. Today it is running a big cam Pontiac 455 with dual 4 barrel carbs. It also has a Muncie 4speed and an Eaton 3.42 12 bolt POSI rear end.

All 4 Pontiacs where featured in The Legend Magazine. Our Pontiacs have also appeared in Pontiac Enthusiast, Street Machine, Cars and Parts, and Lets Go Cruisin.

These cars are not museum pieces. While our racing days are over we drive them to shows all over the Midwest. Barb says, "The only thing that belongs on a trailer is a boat." We hope to keep cruising for many years to come in our Pontiacs or in Barb's favorite car a restored 65 Olds Cutlass convertible, but that is another story.


