Antifreeze: It used to be simple by S. Schaeffer

We all grew up with the green antifreeze, Ethylene Glycol. With a 50/50 mix with water, it protected your engine to -35 degrees. With a 15 pound radiator pressure cap your coolant would not boil until it reached 265 degrees. Ethylene glycol has been marketed for years. It contains corrosion inhibitors, silicates and phosphates. It also contains water pump seal lubricant. We used it in all the cars we winterized for years. When you go to your favorite auto parts store you are in for a shock. Remember the ad campaign, "It's not your father's Oldsmobile"? The same thing now happened to antifreeze. The container now says for use in all pre-1995 GM cars, Ford pre-2002, Chrysler pre-2001 and most others pre-1980.

There have been so many changes now that you need a chemist or a score card to keep up. American cars use antifreeze containing silicates and phosphates. In Japan their makes use antifreeze containing phosphates and other rust inhibitors. They do not use silicates. In Europe the reverse holds true they use silicates and other inhibitors, but they do not use phosphates.

GM cars starting in 1996 use Dex-Cool. It is red in color and is made with "organic acid technology".

Chrysler, starting in 2002, and Ford starting in 2003, use an anti freeze called G05. It is an orangey red color. Some people call it pink. This is a different product than Dex-Cool. It uses a different formula and is a "Hybrid organic acid formula".

Honda, starting in 2001 and up, has their own formula which is blue in color. The other Asian cars use a hybrid organic acid formula that is pink in color. This antifreeze has a different inhibitor formula than American antifreeze.

Automobiles from Europe use their own blue or yellow antifreeze.

I am not mixing coolants. Yes it is a real pain to have to stock so many different coolants. However I have heard some real horror stories about not sticking to the factory fill and mixing coolant types.

The antifreeze manufactures have come out with Global/ Universal antifreeze that is supposed to mix with everything. I have not tried it yet. I would not recommend it for any automobile or truck still in factory warranty. I once made the mistake of mixing conventional green antifreeze with conventional yellow antifreeze. It looked like rusty water. The coolant overflow bottle turned brown. It required a major flush and refill.

Check your owner's manual for the correct coolant to use. The change over years are especially critical to see what the factory fill was.. Also it is time to check the antifreeze protection level in all your cars. Besides the antifreeze type check to see if you are purchasing premixed or full strength antifreeze. Fall is officially here and old man winter is on his way. (Article was written and submitted before this issue; Old Man Winter is most definitely here!).
