The GTP 3800 Supercharged V-6 Engine by S. Schaeffer

The GTP 3800 Supercharged V-6 engine is a real powerhouse. With a net horsepower rating of 240HP in the GTP and 260HP in the Grand Prix GTP Comp G at 5200 RPM these are very under rated engines. The supercharged engine also produces 280 foot-pounds of torque at 3200 RPM. Substantial horsepower is available in modified form. Melting the tires in first gear, my GTP ran similar times to my Tri-Power '64 GTO when it was also traction limited and pure stock. Today there are many GTPs turning times that our 60's muscle cars only ran in our dreams.

The 3800 was a Buick built engine. The only GM engine with a longer production span is the Chevrolet small block V-8. In 1961, Pontiac created the Tempest four cylinder engine by cutting 4 cylinders off the 389 V-8. Buick liked this economical idea. In 1962, Buick cut 2 cylinders off the 215 aluminum V-8 to build the cast iron 198 cubic inch V-6. This became a 231 cubic inch V-6. The first engines were odd fire V-6s because they had 2 connecting rods attached to each crankshaft journal just like a V-8. This made for a very strong crankshaft, but a rough running engine. In 1977, a special crankshaft was designed with offset journals. With just one connecting rod connected to each crank journal this became a very smooth running engine. This even fire V-6 became the basis for the 3800 that came out in 1988.

The 1988 3800 engine had a redesigned block to better align the cylinders with the even fire crankshaft. Additional upgrades included lightweight pistons, roller lifters, and a balance shaft to reduce vibration. The first supercharged 3800 appeared in the Park Ave Ultra in 1991. In 1995, the 3800 was upgraded again to the Series II 3800 V-6. It has 3.80 inch bore and a 3.40 inch stroke. The supercharged version first appeared in 1995 in the Park Ave Ultra and the Riviera. With the redesign of the Grand Prix for 1997 this became the GTP engine. The supercharged engine has a compression ratio of 9 to 1.





The GTP 3800 Supercharged V-6 Engine continued

The supercharged Series II 3800 engine created a new interest in V-6 performance. This engine uses many state of the art parts. It has beehive style valve springs, roller rocker arms, and very strong 3/8 inch diameter pushrods. Of course it also has the redesigned block, cylinder heads, light weight pistons with full floating pins, even fire crankshaft, balance shaft, and a hydraulic lifter roller camshaft. The block also uses cross bolted main bearing caps on all but the rear main bearing. Like many performance engines, it also uses a full length windage tray to lower windage horsepower loss and to provide quicker drain back for the oil thrown from the crankshaft at high RPM. It also has a 60 pound oil pump.



With the supercharger you get instant performance. Unlike with a turbo, it doesn't have to spool up first. You don't get the dreaded turbo lag. The more air and fuel you can pack into a cylinder, the more power an engine will make. A normally aspirated engine is restricted to the amount of air that can be pushed in by atmospheric pressure alone. The Eaton built supercharger is a giant air pump. It raises the pressure inside the intake manifold. When the intake valves open, more air and fuel flow into the cylinders, increasing the power.

The GTP 3800 Supercharged V-6 Engine continued

All the power producing parts that you would add to a normally aspirated engine will work on the GTP, plus a few more.

- 1. Smaller blower pulley. The stock pulley is 3.8 inches in diameter. The aftermarket offers 3.6 and 3.4 inch pulleys. Overdriving the supercharger increases the boost pressure from the stock 6psi. More boost, more horsepower.
- 2. Air to air intercooler. When the supercharger compresses the air it also heats it up. Colder denser air makes more horsepower.
- 3. Cold air induction kit. The under hood air is too hot for ultimate performance.
- Larger throttle body. More cubic feet per minute of air. Just like adding a bigger carb in the old days. Also you may need high flow fuel injectors.
- 5. Performance thermostat 180 degrees. The stock thermostat is rated at 195 degrees and the engine runs at least 10 degrees hotter than that. A cooler engine makes more power.
- 6. Performance exhaust. Start with ported exhaust manifolds or coated headers. The stock exhaust manifold has a 1 and ¾ inch opening where the crossover pipe meets it. Also add a cat-back exhaust system. Note the outlet on the stock exhaust manifold is 2 and ¾ inches where the head pipe meets it.
- 7. Reprogramed power train control module [PCM- computer] and dyno-tuning.
- 8. Performance hydraulic roller camshaft or high ratio roller rocker arms. Comp Cams has a hydraulic roller blower performance camshaft in their Xtreme Energy line up. It works best with a pulley change for increased boost. It also requires special valve springs. The operating range is 1,000 to 5,500 RPM. Comp Cams part number is 76-802-9. Advertised duration is 264 degrees intake, 274 degrees exhaust and .512 lift. You can also check with other manufactures.
- 9. Forged pistons. Don't exceed the stock compression ratio of 9 to 1 if you want to run pump gas.
- 10. Ported cylinder heads.

A mild buildup would consist of the fresh air intake, smaller blower pulley, cat back exhaust, and a reprogrammed computer. A more aggressive buildup would add the special blower grind roller camshaft and valve springs. As well as headers or ported stock exhaust manifolds. Also the PCM would need to be updated for the additional boost.

It is possible to add 100 horsepower to the 3800 GTP engine and still be very street friendly. Work with one of the 3800 performance specialists to figure out which parts you need and what to order. You don't need overhead cams and 4 valve per cylinder head to make pure old American pushrod generated horsepower. Happiness is a low ET.


