## Cam Selection For Your High Performance Street Engine By Steve Schaeffer



Only you can decide what cam to purchase for your street driven high performance car. Check out the lift, duration and overlap specs. Use the cam duration at .050 lift as a basis of comparison between manufactures, read the ads carefully. A cam with a "good" idle will work fine with a stock converter and power brakes. A cam with a "fair" idle and good mid-range is usually a good choice for a street car. A "fair" idle means it will sound healthy but still have enough vacuum at idle to operate power brakes. You may still need a converter for your automatic transmission with a stall speed of 500 or 600 rpm over stock. Be careful with a cam advertised as "rough" idle and powerful mid to upper range power. It will shake your teeth out at a traffic light and you will not be able to lug the engine down in 4th gear with a manual transmission. It is no fun driving thru town at 3,000 rpm in 3rd gear because the cam will not allow the engine to pull below 2,000 rpm. It will require a vacuum reservoir to operate the power brakes, a high stall speed converter and a low rear gear. Do not over cam your street driven car. Remember that 95 percent of your driving is not for racing.



# Cam Selection For Your High Performance Street Engine continued

#### Installation

Install your new cam with new lifters, new valve springs and retainers if necessary, new timing chain set, and the proper assembly lube, as well as motor oil with high levels of zinc. Install the cam straight up using the factory timing gear marks. Do not attempt to advance or retard the cam timing without first degreeing it in. A lot of aftermarket street cams are already ground 4 degrees advanced for more low in power. Read the directions that come with your cam. Lube the lobes on the camshaft and the bottoms of the lifters per directions. I use a little engine assembly lube on the pushrod ends and the bottom of the rocker arms too. I also use it on the pushrod sides were they contact the guide plates. I pre oil the rollers on roller rocker arms. All the wear points should be protected.

On Pontiac and Chevy V-8's, use cylinder heads with screw-in studs and pushrod guide plates. On Oldsmobile heads purchase the screw-in stud conversion kit from Comp Cams. This kit comes with studs, guide plates, roller tip rocker arms, and hardened pushrods for use with guide plates. Increased valve spring pressure will pull the pressed-in studs loose in the heads. You must have an adjustable valve train to use an aftermarket cam. Bottle neck studs such on a Pontiac or bridge type cap screws on an Olds will not work. Also the pushrod guide plates keep the rocker arm running true and prevent the pushrod holes from wearing oversize in the heads. If the guide holes wear oversize, you will start bending pushrods.

#### Adjustment

You can adjust the valves by using the following procedures; Chevy and Olds, adjust the valves before installing the intake manifold, Pontiac adjust the valves before installing the pushrod chamber cover and the intake.

Turn the crankshaft so that the number one cylinder is on top dead center and ready to fire. Then adjust exhaust 1-3-4-8 and intake 1-2-5-7. Turn the crankshaft one revolution which will bring number six cylinder to top dead center. Adjust exhaust 2-5-6-7 and intake 3-4-6-8.

When you adjust the valves wiggle the pushrod up and down as you take the slack out by tightening the rocker arm nut. As soon as the pushrod doesn't wiggle up and down and before the plunger in the lifter moves away from the spring clip, STOP. This is zero lash. Now tighten the rocker arm nut  $\frac{1}{2}$  turn. You can see the plunger in the lifter move down, away from the spring clip. This will give you the correct .020- .060 lifter preload. By leaving the pushrod chamber on the engine open you can see the lifter preload. You will not adjust the valves too loose or too tight. After you install the intake, etc., and with the distributor installed correctly, the engine will start right up.



# Cam Selection For Your High Performance Street Engine continued

### **Breaking in Your Cam**

The first  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour of operation with your new cam is critical. Keep the engine rpm over 2,000 rpm. Do not allow the engine to idle. The new cam and lifters require plenty of oil to break in properly. All the parts have to get friendly with one another.

After the first  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour of running change your oil and filter. Be sure you are using oil with high levels of zinc. Roller cams can get by with regular oil but flat tappet cams require oil with the correct additives.

Now you can enjoy your new cam. Listen to the sound of power as you idle in to the Cruise In. Feel the new horse-power perform on the expressways. But remember, when you really want to run it thru the gears, take it to the local drag strip on test and tune nights. It is easier on your driver's license and your insurance company.

Note; Valve adjustment procedure is for all engines that have been converted to a straight screw in rocker arm stud. In the 70's and later GM put Chevy engines in Pontiacs and Oldsmobiles. They also put Pontiac 400's in some full size Oldsmobiles and Olds 403 engines in 2<sup>nd</sup> generation Trans-Ams.
