My love of Pontiacs started with me way back when I was a young lad (in diapers) and my mom had a 1967 Pontiac Lemans (Burgundy – black vinyl top with black rims – no hubcaps). There were baby pictures of me around that car and when I would look at those pictures as a child, I can always remember the menacing look of that front grille and those stacked headlights! I was hooked!!

I can remember in my teens most of my friends had posters of girls in bikini 's on their walls... I had GTO 's! (well.. maybe a few Heather Thomas posters were mixed in there as well;)

My mom even got a rear quarter GTO emblem and had it mounted on a piece of wood for my dresser and I still have it to this day!



She was my biggest supporter of my "Pontiac Craze" back

then. One year for Christmas she had a white sweatshirt air-brushed with a 67 GTO on it with the words, "Brian 's Dream" at the bottom. It 's sad to say that I don 't have that shirt anymore.

When I was 16, my friends and I couldn 't wait for the weekly Auto Trader to hit the newsstands. My buddy would be looking for 68 Camaro 's but I was on the hunt for a 67 GTO; sadly, I was never able to find one. I would have to wait 15 years to get behind the wheel of my first Goat!

Fast forward to the Summer of 2004, fresh off a pretty severe motorcycle accident, and in no
rush to get back on one, I start looking for a new hobby. It was time to move from 2 wheels to 4
wheels. With a nice fat insurance check from the totaled motorcycle, the hunt was on!!

Searching e-bay and other car forums on a nightly basis at work, I came across a blue 1967 GTO in Des Moines Iowa. Much to my surprise, nobody was bidding on this car! It was a bench seat, column automatic GTO. My guess was that people thought it was a "clone" after getting pictures of the VIN Tag and the serial numbers but I knew it was the real deal. So I sat and waited, and waited, and then with about 15 minutes left in the auction I opened up three different web browsers, just in case I lost my session, and I refreshed the auction every 5 seconds. We got it home and couldn 't wait to start working on it and it was in great shape and there were a few "easy" fixes that needed to be addressed to make it truly road worthy. That summer was great!

In the fall of 2010, I was in the market for a new car, so I thought to myself, why not a newer GTO? And the hunt was on again!

On September 10, 2010, I found it outside of Detroit Michigan. It was a 2006 Pontiac GTO – Black with Red Leather interior / 6 speed with 18 " rims! It was perfect! My buddy and I drove up to pick it up and he followed me home. I was back! (and in Black! I played that song about 30 times on the way home with the car.

I kept it stock for the first few years then, we all know how it goes; 1 mod turns into a complete engine teardown, and before you know it you have a car that you never ever dreamed of own-ing!

It is now sporting a 408ci LS2 Stroker crankshaft with Diamond pistons, Comp-Star rods, Kooks long tube headers, Corsa Sport exhaust, custom grind Comp. Cam, F.A.S.T 92mm ported intake manifold, Vararam cold air intake, Level 2 Monster Clutch, and a few other goodies that has this bad boy now pushing 480hp and 500tq at the wheels! Electric Fuel Pump Install by Steve Schaeffer

I have mounted an electric fuel pump back at the tank on all 4 of my 4 speed vintage muscle cars. I still have it feed thru the factory mechanical pump on the engine, an inline fuel filter, and then in to the carburetor. I have them wired thru a relay to keep the drain on the charging system down. I also have a toggle switch mounted under the dash so I can use the electric pump to prime the carburetor before I start the car if it has been sitting for a while.

With a modified big cubic engine, big camshaft, high flow cylinder heads, headers, and one or two 4 barrel carbs, or Tri-Power, with the stock fuel pump, when you really wind it out thru the gears,

you will suddenly feel like the engine hit a rev limiter. If you have a fuel pressure gauge hooked up, by the time you have run it out hard thru 1st and 2nd gears, at the top of 3rd gear the fuel pressure gauge drops to near zero.

With the addition of a good street or strip electric fuel pump you will never run out of fuel pressure again. The red Holley street pump, Jeg 's #510-12-801-1, \$114.95, puts out 7 psi and 97 gph [gallons per hour] and is safe to run without a fuel pressure regulator

except with a Tri-Power. It is reasonably quiet as well. The blue Holley street/strip pump, Jeg 's #510-12-802-1,\$136.95 puts out 14 psi and 110gph and definitely requires a regulator which is included. The Holly HP fuel pump uses a gerotor instead of standard vanes and is much quieter but runs \$221.95 for the street pump, #510-12-125. This pump can supply 110gph @ 7psi. It will support up to 700HP.The street/strip pump is #510-12-150 for \$243.95 and re-

quires a regulator which also comes with it. That pump will supply 140gph @ 16psi. It will support up to 900HP. Jeg 's street pump, #555-15913 is the same size as the Holly red pump for less money \$78.99, it works great, but it is really loud. It is rated at 95gph. Edelbrock recommends 6.5 psi of fuel pressure for their carbs. This also seems to work fine with a GM Q-Jet as well. With Tri-Power I run a regulator and 4 psi of pressure. More than that seems to overpower the needle and seats in the carbs and cause flooding.

I also figured out how to mount the electric fuel pump back at the tank without drilling any holes in the car. At a hardware store I purchase two pieces of flat metal stock, 1/8 " x 1 "x 3 feet. I then cut them to the length I need , approximately 24 inches, to overlap the straps that hold the fuel tank up. I then drill 6 holes in each piece so I can put a bolt thru them on either side of the fuel tank straps and 2 bolts to hold the fuel pump in place. I sandwich in the fuel tank straps and the double thickness gives the fuel pump plenty of support. Works like a charm and looks very professional. The pump has to be mounted as close to the gas tank as possible. Also the pump is designed to push fuel rather than pull it.

The pump inlet has to be mounted below the sending unit outlet in the gas tank. This also keeps the pump and the fuel lines away from any moving objects and the exhaust system. The Holley HP pumps are much bigger physically than the traditional red or blue Holley pumps. I mount those on two sets of brackets.

Depending on the engine and the carburation I usually fabricate a bracket that bolts to the engine for a fuel pressure regulator. On most race cars you see them mounted to the fender well or on the firewall, but again I don 't want to drill holes.

Jeg 's sells a fuel pump harness and relay kit for \$26.99, part #555-10564. It includes 10 gauge and 18 gauge wire, a 30 amp relay/circuit breaker, and assorted terminals. You wire it thru a key operated on/off switch. Otherwise I use a 30 amp relay from the parts store, and inline fuse, a toggle switch, and get power off the fuse box from a circuit that is only hot with the key on. Most electric fuel pumps come with directions on how to install a fuel pump relay. Again, not drilling holes, I hide the relay behind the battery.

You can also wire into the system an oil pressure safety switch Holly P/N 12-810. This will shut off the pump if the engine stalls or if the key is in the on position with the engine not running. Jegs oil pressure safety switch is part number 555-11200 for \$20.99 and will shut off the pump if the oil pressure drops below 5psi.





These same pumps, regulators, wiring kits, etc. are also available from many other speed equipment dealers and most auto parts stores and sometimes a racers discount is available. I have also seen some small 12 volt solid state pumps at different auto parts stores. These are usually low pressure, low volume, and will really only work to prime the carburetor if the car has been sitting for a while. All of the pumps listed are for use with a carburetor not fuel injection. There are quite a few other manufactures of electric fuel pumps as well, but my experience has been primarily with Holley over the years. If you need to contact them their web site is www.holley.com. 



