I 'm looking at our 65 GTO convertible hoping that the rebuilt power steering pump finally heals the leak it 's had for most of this year and wondering if I should give up on the 3.90 gears or switch to a 5 speed transmission. The car has been a part of the family for 45 years so it 's hard to start hacking on it. 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Milt Schornack: 1935-2020



'61 Pontiac Ventura 421, 4 Speed by Steve Schaeffer

This '61 Pontiac Ventura is owned by Bud Krebs of The Ohio Valley GTO Club. For many years it was powered by a real 421 Super Duty Dual Quad 421 engine.

It is not a show car but with a 4:30 rear end it made many trips down the quarter mile. Sometimes on the drag strip and sometimes not. He loved to pick on Ralph Carr's 409 horsepower 409, 4 speed.

When I first met Bud, over 40 years ago, I had my red '64 GTO running a built 348 horsepower 389, 4 speed. My car was running C Stock at the time. I was running 13.70's at 106 on 7 inch wide slicks. Bud said," My car runs mid 13's." I looked at him with some disbelief. He then threw a \$50.00 bill on the table and said," If you don't believe me the slicks are in the trunk."



After many years of violent 6,000 RPM shifts the engine dropped a valve. One combustion chamber in the original 306 casting numbers heads had 2 holes punched in it. It filled one cylinder with water, bent a forged steel Super Duty connecting rod and cracked one cylinder wall.

'61 Pontiac Ventura 421, 4 Speed

The 421 needs major expensive repairs. With machine shops booked up and 4 bolt main 421 blocks in short supply and 306 casting heads as rare as hens teeth I stepped up to help my old friend get back on the road.

I put together a '70 Pontiac 455 H.O. engine, 4 bolt main bored .030 over to 462 cubic inches. It is running the good 6x heads, 9.5 to 1 compression. The valve train is all Crane with a Power Max 278-2 cam. Lift is .467 intake and .494 exhaust. Duration at .050 is 222 degrees on the intake and 234 degrees on the exhaust. The intake is a Performance Products dual plain high riser running an Edelbrock 800 cfm carb. He also has an Offenhauser High Rise dual quad manifold that will go on later with the rejetted 421 carbs.

Bud added the original 421 Super Duty cast iron headers, the rare Super Duty heavy duty starter with the solenoid mounted on the bottom, and a new 2.5 inch exhaust system. He also put a street gear in the rear end and drove the freshly assembled car to the GTOAA Car Show in Columbus. It never even got a chance for a good bath.

On Desk Top Dyno the engine made 461 Horsepower at 5,000 RPM. It also puts out 549 foot pounds of torque at 4,000 RPM.

Look out Mr. 409 Bud is gunning for you!


