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Your Front End is Loose by Steve Schaeffer

Your Muscle Car needs to go, stop, and steer, to really be an enjoyable ride. There are a lot of articles on rebuilding your engine either for high performance or as a restoration. The same is true about transmissions, rear ends, and brakes. However, not much is said about your car's front end.

To steer and handle properly there a lot a lot of components to redo. You need to bring your front- end steering and suspension back to original equipment specs. It is no fun when you constantly are forced to correct the steering because the car is all over the road.

A proper rebuild requires replacing all the steering linkage, and rebuilding or replacing the steering gear box. This includes tie rod ends, sleeves, the center link, idler arm, and sometimes even the pitman arm on the steering gear box.

The suspension consists of the front upper and lower control arms, which usually need new bushings and ball joints. Then move on to springs, shocks, sway bar links and possibly a larger diameter front sway bar.

A lot of our cars started out as daily drivers or street/strip cars. Components got replaced as needed unless you were doing a frame off restoration.

I have found the most neglected part in the front end are the control arm bushings because they are very labor intensive to change. If you are doing it yourself allow a full day, plus the front- end alignment. Most people will replace ball joints without ever removing the control arms. On the upper control arms you cut out the rivets that hold the ball joint in and replace them with special bolts. The lower ball joints press in and your local auto parts store usually has the tool kit that you can borrow.


















To replace the control arm bushings you need to remove the control arms from the chassis. Be sure the car is properly supported on jack stands or a lift. Use a coil spring compressor and be dam careful. If a coil spring is released without a spring compressor it can come flying out with deadly force.

The bushings and sleeves can be cut out with an air chisel or by hand. They can be hammered in using a driver or pressed in. I suggest buying both oval and round bushings and returning the ones you don't use. The upper control arms use round bushings and the lowers use both round and oval.

Sometimes the new coil springs make the front of the car set a little higher, throwing off the ride height. When this happens the top of the front tires lean in. The car has negative camber and even removing all the shims will not correct it. Moog manufactures offset control arm shafts to correct this problem, part number K5250. Both Jeg's and Summit racing stock them. They provide + 1/1.5 degrees of camber adjustment. It may be a good idea to install them when you install the upper control arm bushings. If you don't need them a couple of extra shims solve the problem. However if you do need them it is a lot of extra labor. These shafts fit '64 to '74 GM "A" bodies and others.

This is a lot of wrenching but when the job is finished and the front end is aligned it will drive like a new car again. Please read your car's shop manual or a Motor's or Chilton's Auto Repair Manual before under-taking this project. Also remember to practice safety first. If in doubt turn this over to a pro-
