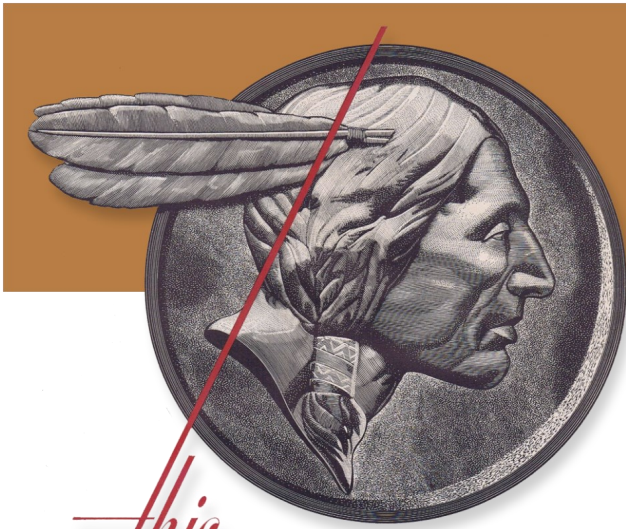

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

It is that time of year where I start to notice the days are getting just a bit longer. It is an encouraging sign that spring is coming (though not as fast as I would like) and before we know it, time to get our cars out of hibernation. It is also a sign that I am again behind on the winter projects I had considered for this year...oh well, I guess deep down I would rather work on the car while it is warm out and we have many additional hours of daylight. If you have winter projects (not that I am trying to push you), just a reminder, by the time you read this letter we will only have about 20 days until the vernal equinox!

WOW...my simple description of the Mecum Kissimmee and Motor City Auctions held in Florida this past January. From the results, it would appear Covid-19 did not have any negative impact on collector car values or popularity. Mecum Kissimmee's 10-day Auction resulted in \$122.8 million in sales which set a new single event record. 2000 cars crossed the block with an amazing 89% sell through rate, an extremely high sell through rate for an auction with reserves. A few days after Kissimmee, Mecum added another \$18.4 million in sales by way of their Motor City Museum Auction. Total sales (including fees) from the two auctions came in at just over \$141,000,000...WOW! The top sale honors went to Carol Shelby's personal charcoal grey 1965 Shelby 427 Cobra which hammered for \$5,400,000 (\$5,940,000 after fees)! The auction saw 7 cars sell for more than \$1,000,000. There were 33 GTO's on the block between the two auctions and all but two cars sold. The only Gen 2 car, a 2004, sold for \$16,500 which was the least expensive GTO. The highest price tag GTO was an extremely nice 1969 Judge that sold for \$181,500! 81% of the GTO's that sold were north of \$60,000. As mentioned in last month's Paw Prints, we had two members that had cars in the Kissimmee auction. Congratulations again to Lonnie McLaughlin on the sale of his '65 Bluemist Slate Convertible and to Kevin Landis on the sale of a '64 Nocturne Blue Hardtop that he did the concours nut and bolt restoration on.

Our 2021 Swap meet is a go! Rob Wilson has sent out the sign-up sheet. As Rob mentioned we will be gathering at 6:30 PM on Saturday, March 13th to set up club items and mark off the vendor spaces. On Sunday, the 14th our vendors will begin setting up at 8:00 AM and the doors will be open to the public from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Please help if you can, the more the merrier!

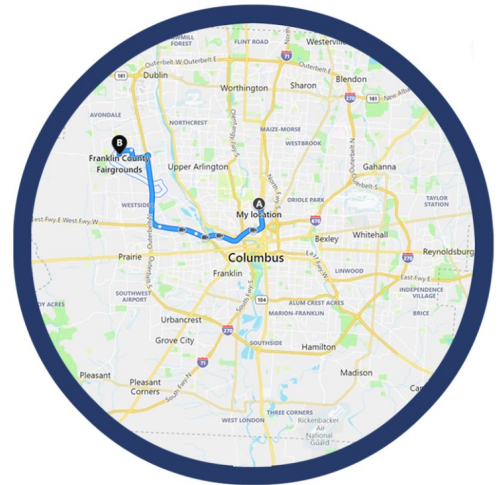

Prevent Blindness, Ohio Affiliate was founded in 1957. Our mission is to prevent blindness and preserve sight. Did you know that 50% of vision loss is needless and can be avoided by seeing your eye doctor regularly and using protective eyewear at home, work, and play? It's easy to do and the rewards are so wonderful seeing the beautiful faces of your


children and grandchildren, fully taking in a sporting event (like a GTO show), seeing that open road in front of you on a summer day's drive...there's a lot to be said for the freedom and independence that healthy vision provides to us!

The club's generous contributions over the past three decades have gone to support our programs and services that aim to help people at highest risk for vision loss:

- We vision screen Ohioans of all ages to find eye problems early when they can be corrected most successfully and we train others to do the same for their companies and organizations.

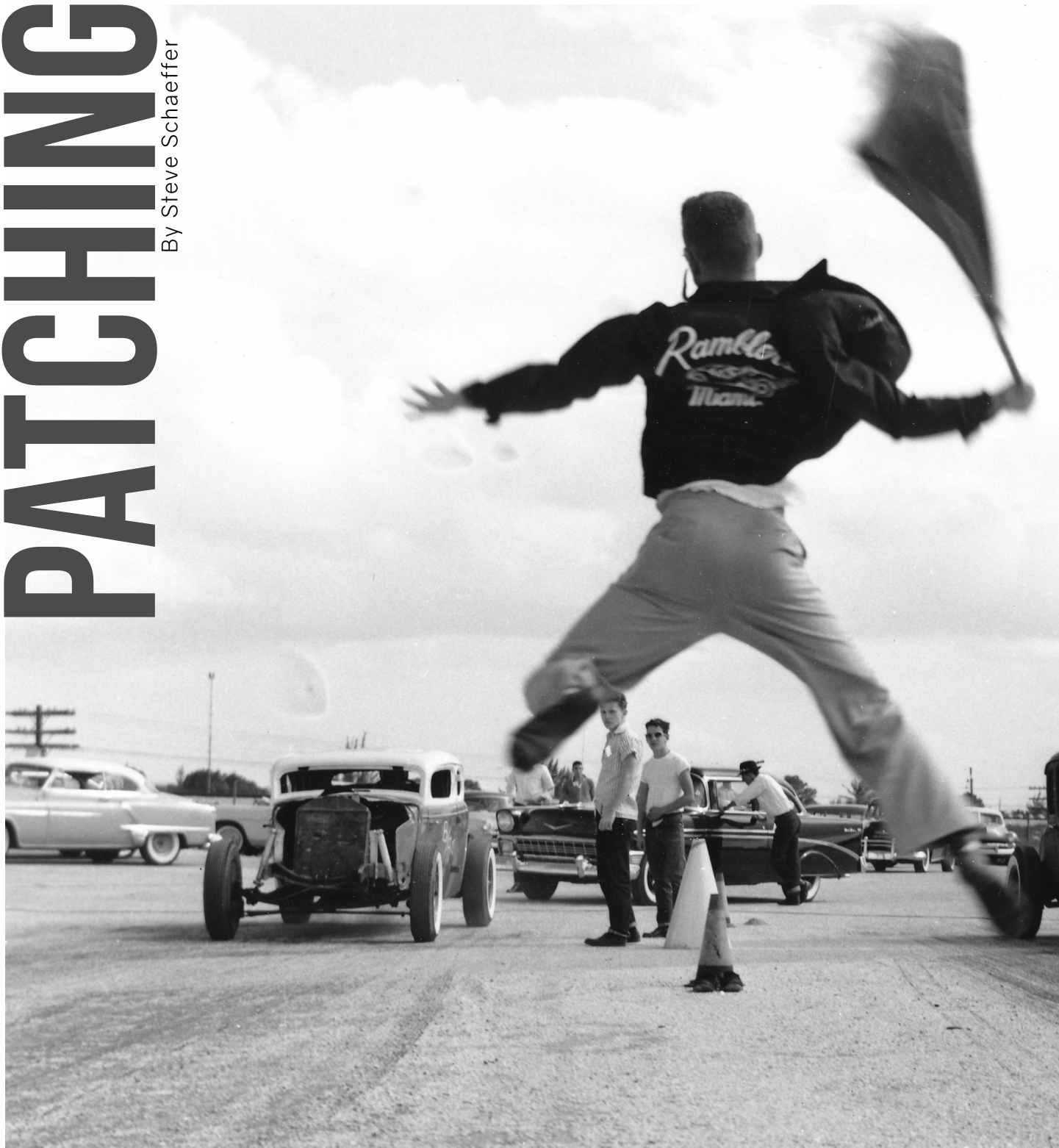

And a victory that wasn't won.



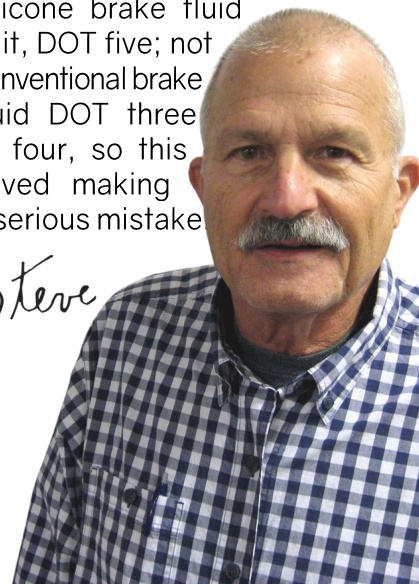
TECHNICALLY SPEAKING

Working on vintage car brakes today. Couldn't decide if it had silicone brake fluid or conventional brake fluid. You cannot mix them. Siphon some of the brake fluid out of the master cylinder and put it in a jar with water. See the picture with the can of brake fluid in it? Since conventional brake fluid is hydroscopic, it mixed completely. The bottom picture is silicone brake fluid and water and you can see it did not mix. This particular car did have silicone brake fluid in it, DOT five; not conventional brake fluid DOT three or four, so this saved making a serious mistake

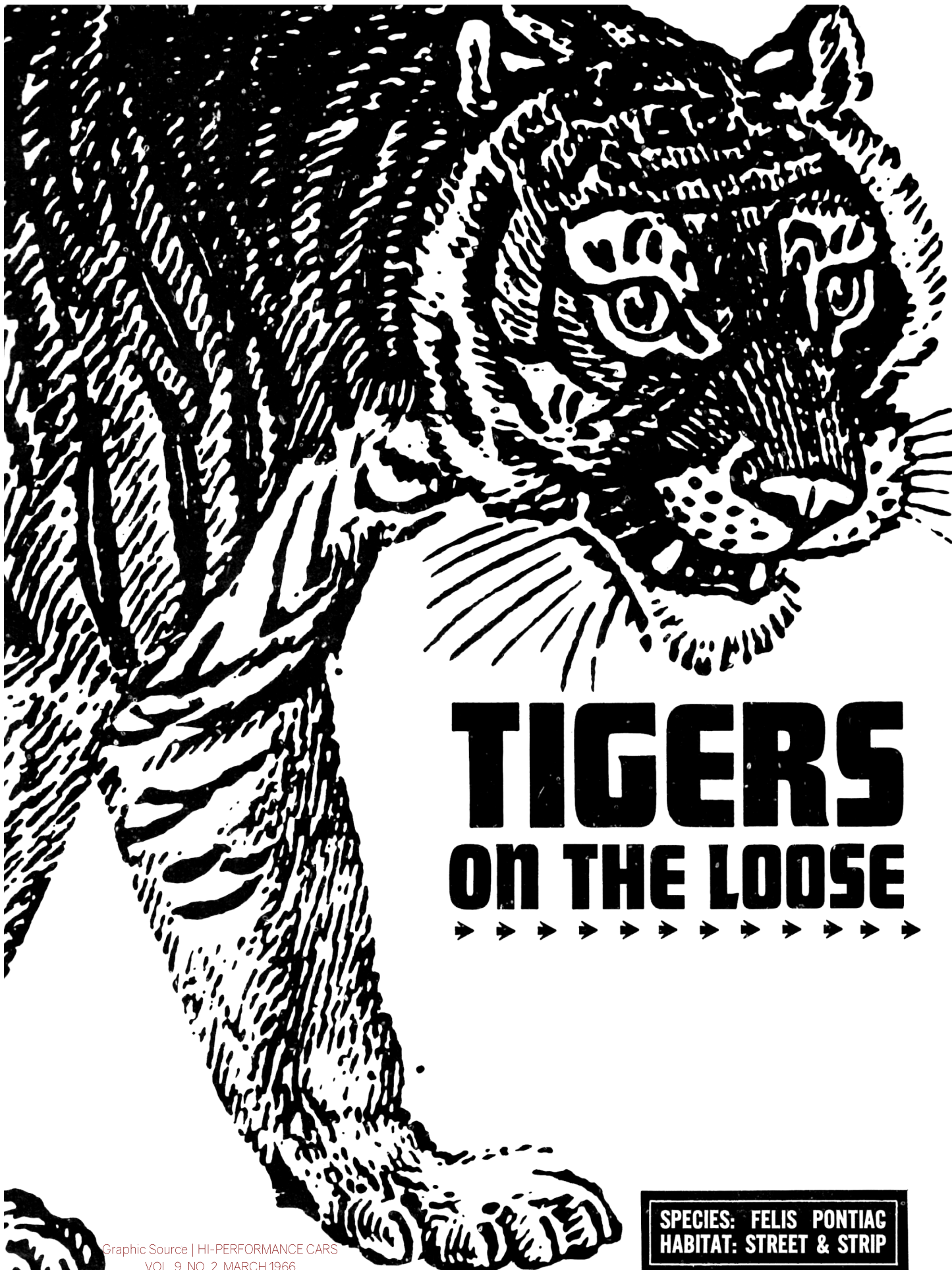
